EXPANDING SENTENCES: Let's Get Complex!

Great writers expand their sentences in order to include details and a variety of sentence types. A complex sentence has at least one independent clause and one dependent clause.

A subordinating conjunction connects an independent clause and a dependent clause. It helps make a complex sentence smooth.
