





Writing Topic Sentences

Great writers are focused, stay on topic, and organize their paragraphs. It is helpful to follow correct paragraph structure.

- A topic sentence tells the main idea of the paragraph or text.
- Supporting details follow the topic sentence. They give more details and evidence.
- A concluding sentence at the end of the paragraph ties it all together.
