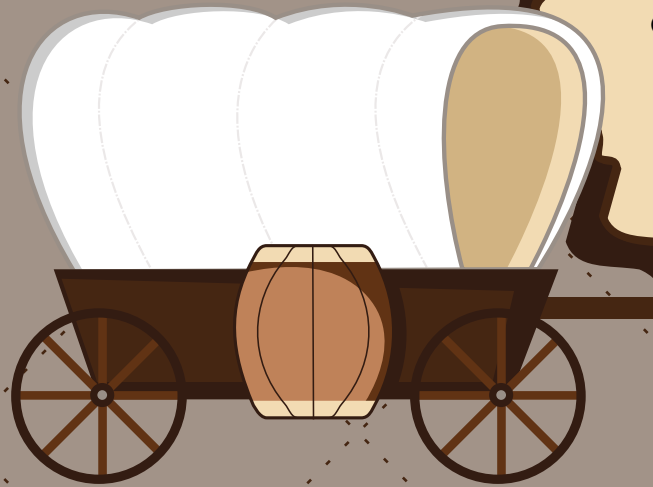
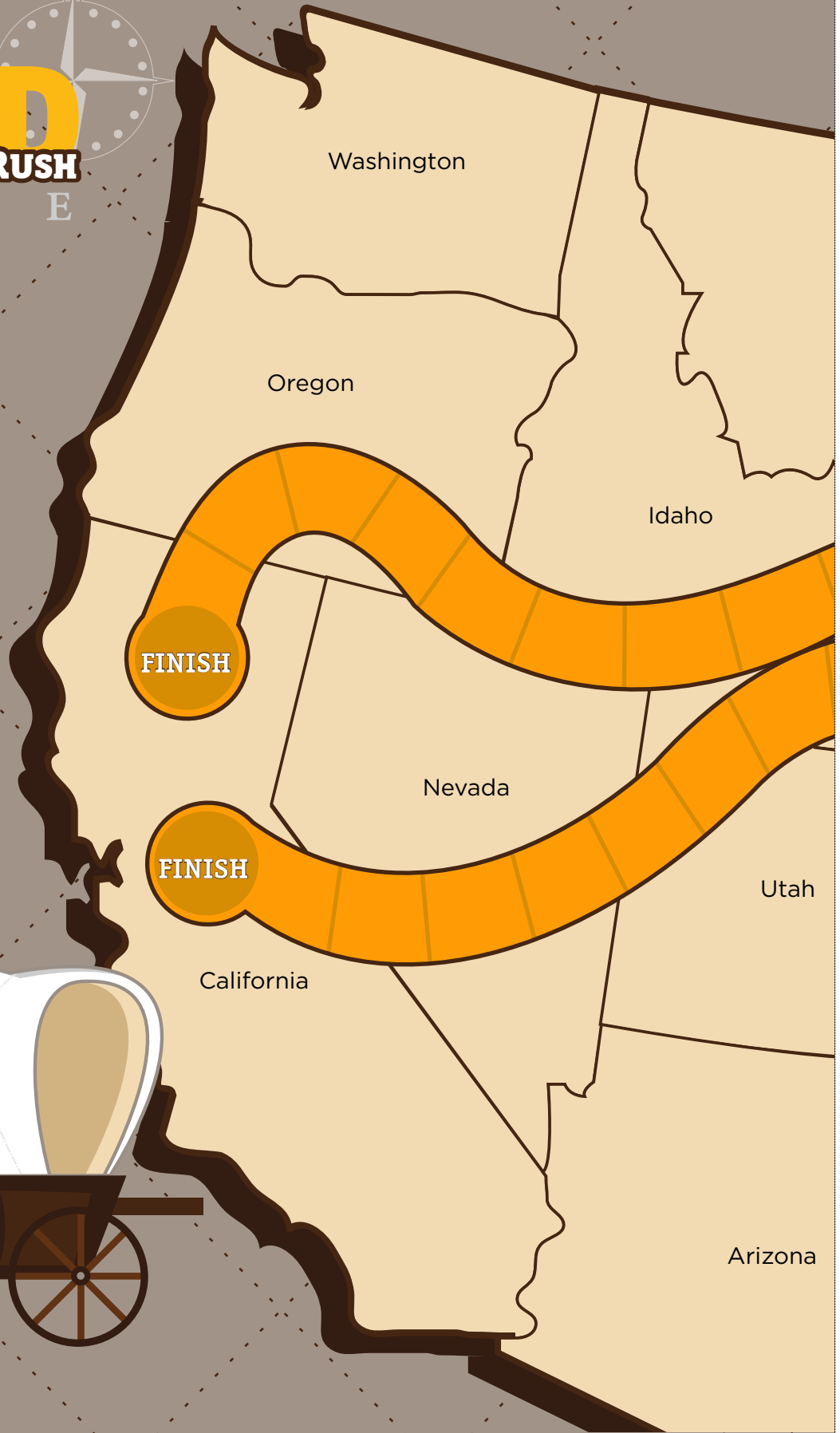
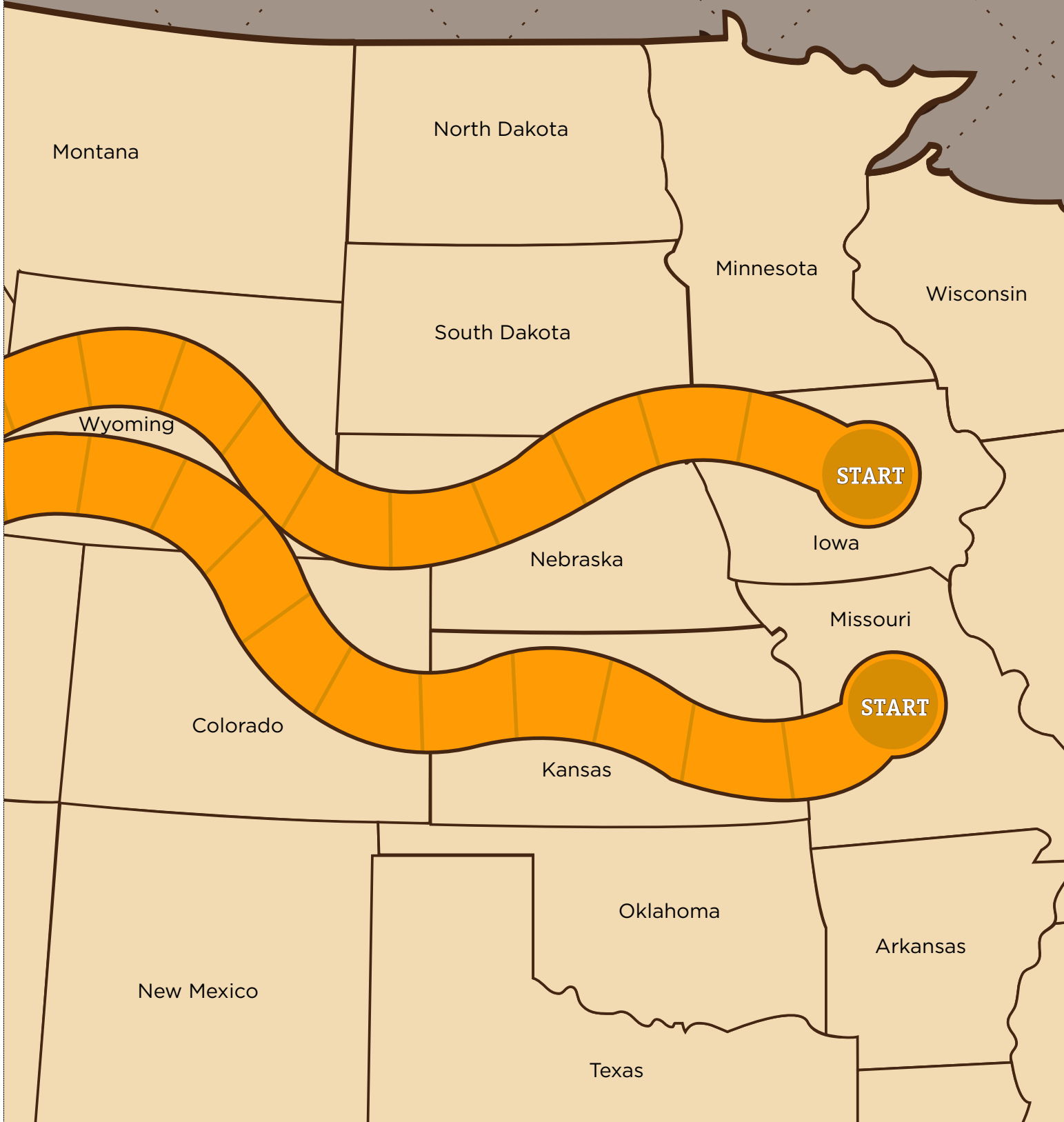


THE GOLD RUSH GAME
