

Grammar Basics: Object Pronouns #2

A **pronoun** is a substitute for a noun.

A **subject pronoun** is the subject of the sentence.

FOR EXAMPLE:

Shelly put the pastries on cooling racks. | She put the pastries on cooling racks.
noun pronoun

An **object pronoun** is the object of the sentence.

FOR EXAMPLE:

Shelly put the pastries on cooling racks. | Shelly put them on cooling racks.
noun pronoun
