
Using the Verb "To Be"

The verb **to be** tells what the subject of a sentence is doing or feeling. It links the subject to the words that describe it. For example:



Forms of the verb <u>to be:</u>

<u>Present tense</u>

Past tense

l **am** He, she, it **is** You, we **are** l, he, she, it **was** You, we **were**
