

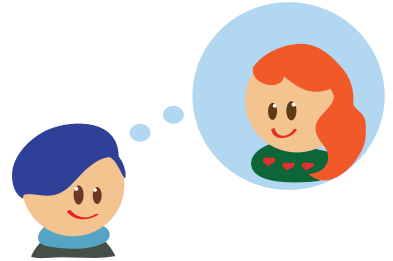
TWO TO TOO

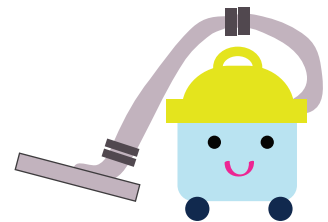
