

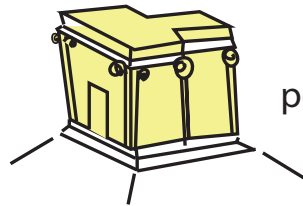
The Story of Hanukkah
