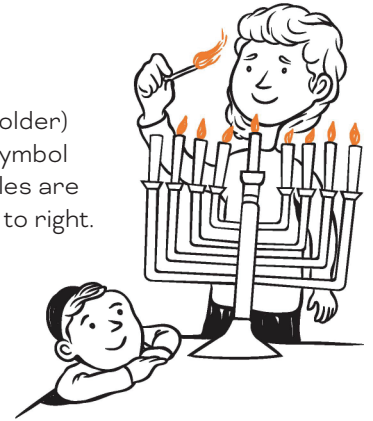


HANUKKAH TRADITIONS

Hanukkah is a Jewish holiday that is celebrated over eight days. It is also known as the Festival of Lights, or Feast of Dedication. The illustrations below show some of the traditions of Hanukkah.



Fried foods are often eaten during Hanukkah to celebrate the miracle of Hanukkah oil. The most popular of these foods are latkes (potato pancakes) and sufganiyot (donuts).



The menorah (candle holder) is the most important symbol of Hanukkah. The candles are traditionally lit from left to right.

During Hanukkah, kids play the dreidel game. A dreidel is a four-sided spinning top. If you win, you receive gelt, which is either real money or chocolate coins!



Children are given a gift for each of the eight days of Hanukkah.
