

Using Hay ("aye")

"Hay" has two meanings: **there is** and **there are**.

Examples

- Hay un león en la selva.----->There is a lion in the jungle.
- Hay muchos leones en la selva.----->There are many lions in the jungle.
- Hay tres leones en la selva.----->There are three lions in the jungle.

"Hay" can also be used to ask questions: **Is there?** and **Are there?**

Examples

- ¿Hay un pez en ese vaso?----->Is there a fish in that cup?
- ¿Hay cinco peces en ese vaso?----->Are there five fish in that cup?
