hispanic christmas traditions

Christmas in Spanish-speaking countries is very different from the holiday in the U.S. In some places, it's celebrated during the summer! Can you imagine Santa delivering toys in summer clothes?

Streets are decorated with lights, garlands, and flowers. Nine days before Christmas the families pray novenas and prepare the nativity scene. A novena is a prayer asking for special graces. In some countries there is a ritual called las Posadas, a procession to remember Mary and Joseph's trip from Nazareth to Bethlehem. A group of people walk from house to house carrying pictures of saints, lighted candles and singing Christmas songs.

On Christmas Eve, families meet for dinner, sing villancicos, and pray. Villancicos are the most popular traditional Christmas songs. Some people decide to go to misa del gallo or midnight mass. Children wait for Santa Claus to come to their houses. Other Spanish names for Santa are Papá Noel, San Nicolás or Viejo Pascuero.
