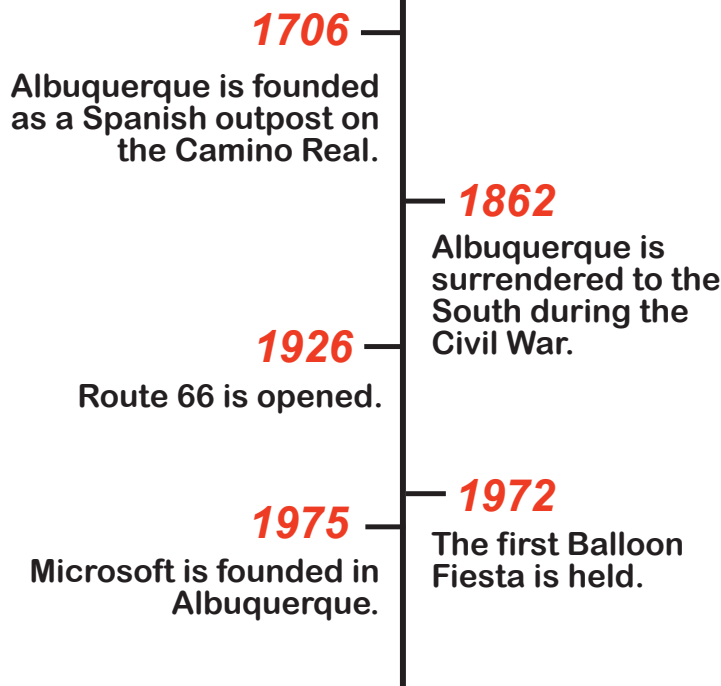

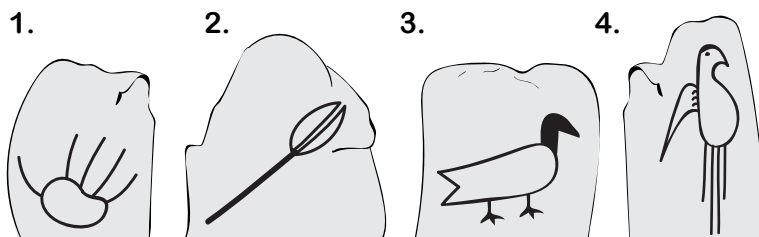

## What are *petroglyphs*?

Petroglyphs are pictures etched into the surface of rocks. The ones at Petroglyph National Monument in Albuquerque date as far back as the 1300s! They described the complex society and religion of the Pueblo Indians who drew them. ## Quiz

Answer: Tewa, a Native American language spoken by the Pueblo peoples.
