## Time Line

- 1796** — Surveyors map the land and name it after the project's leader, Moses Cleaveland.
- 1830s** — Cleveland begins to grow after completion of nearby Erie Canal.
- 1870** — John D. Rockefeller founds Standard Oil in Cleveland.
- late 1800s - mid-1900s** — For almost a century, Cleveland is a major center of industry for products like oil, steel, and automobiles.
- 1995** — The Rock 'n' Roll Hall of Fame opens.

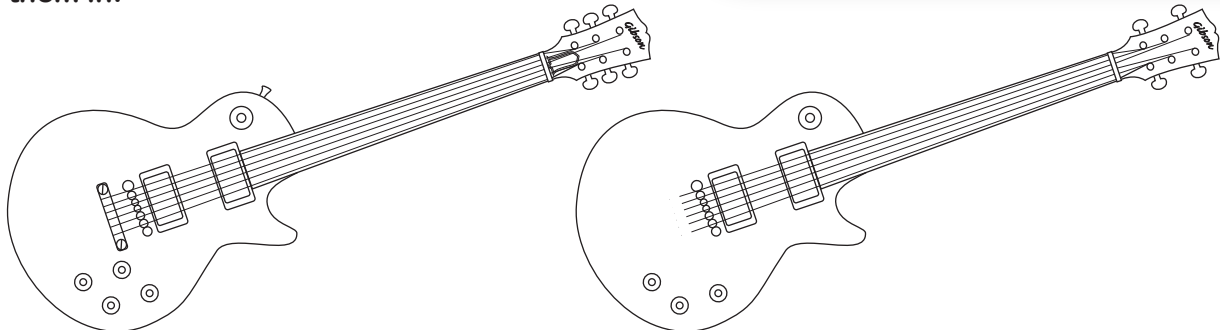
