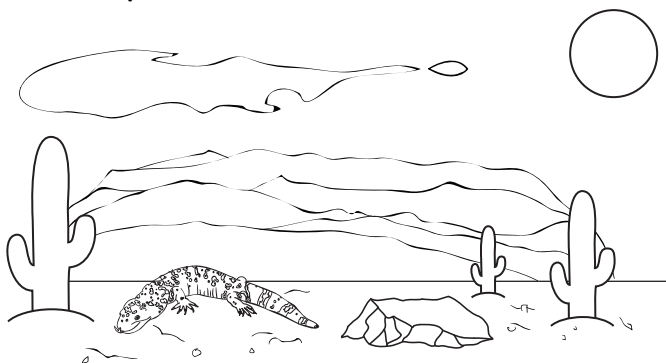
## Quiz
