Identify Subordinating Conjunctions: Camping Trip



A **subordinating conjunction** connects two simple sentences in a special way. Look at this example:

Before Steve left, he took one last picture of the campsite.

In this sentence, **before** is the conjunction. It tells the order the actions occurred.

To help you remember some common coordinating conjunctions, use I SAW A WABUB.
