

Introductory Clauses

Commas are often placed after an introductory clause. Look at the example below. Place commas where they are needed in the sentences below.

EXAMPLE

After the hike, we can set up our tent.

↓ **COMMA** (Placed after the introductory clause)

↑ **INTRODUCTORY CLAUSE**
