Hanbok South Korea or Chosŏn-ot North Korea

is the traditional clothing in Korea, which consists of a top and a bottom.

For women, a hanbok is composed of a jacket and a skirt. The skirt is called *chima*. The *chima* is a full wraparound skirt that is very comfortable. It comes up as high as the armpits. The hanbok also uses ties that are made into knots instead of buttons.

Question:

Describe a chima.

Answer: It is a comfortable full wraparound skirt.

Hanbok South Korea or Chosŏn-ot North Korea

is the traditional clothing in Korea, which consists of a top and a bottom.

For men, a hanbok is composed of a basic upper garment and loose-fitting pants. The upper garment is called *jeogori* and the pants are called *baji*. The hat, or gat, is the headgear commonly worn outside of the house.

Question:

When do Korean men wear gat?

Answer: Whenever they go out of the house
