

Landscape Art Project

Landscape describes any painting or drawing whose main subject is a scenic view. Such scenery includes meadows, hills, mountains, valleys, trees, rivers, forests, coastal views and seascapes. The view may be of a real place, or it may be an imaginary scene. Perspective is used as a method of showing on paper the way that objects appear to get smaller and closer together, the further away they are.

Directions

Note: This worksheet is best if printed out in color.

1. Cut out the sun, trees and the mountains.
2. Arrange the trees so that they are in perspective. (Hint, the farther an object is away from you, the smaller it will look.)
3. When you are satisfied with their placement, you can use a glue stick to glue the pieces in place on another piece of paper.
