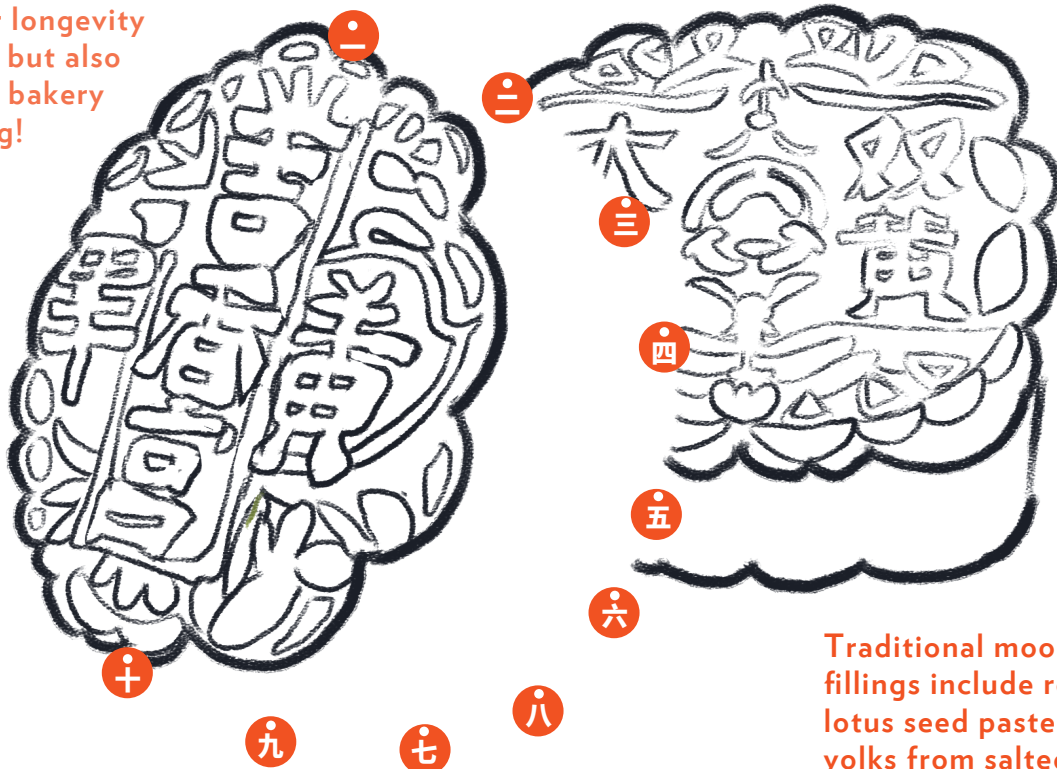

MOON FESTIVAL DOT-TO-DOT

Moon Festival, or Mid-Autumn Festival, is celebrated in countries throughout Asia (and beyond!) in late September or early October when the moon is full. The holiday is celebrated by visiting family and friends, carrying lanterns, and eating pastries called *mooncakes*.

Directions: Use your Chinese number counting skills to connect the dots to create a mooncake. When you are finished, color it in.

Mooncakes are often imprinted with the characters for longevity and harmony, but also the name of a bakery – or the filling!



Traditional mooncake fillings include red bean, lotus seed paste, and yolks from salted duck eggs. They are usually sweet, and shared together with tea!
