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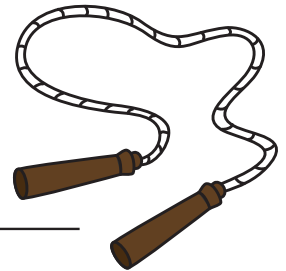

1. Swap old stuff with a friend: What are some things you could swap with a friend?



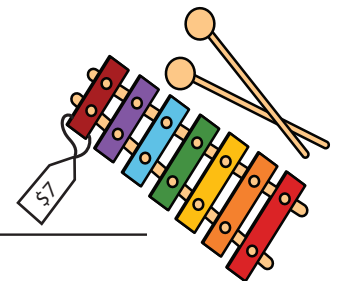
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2. Donate old goods to charity: Are there items in your room or home you could give away?
