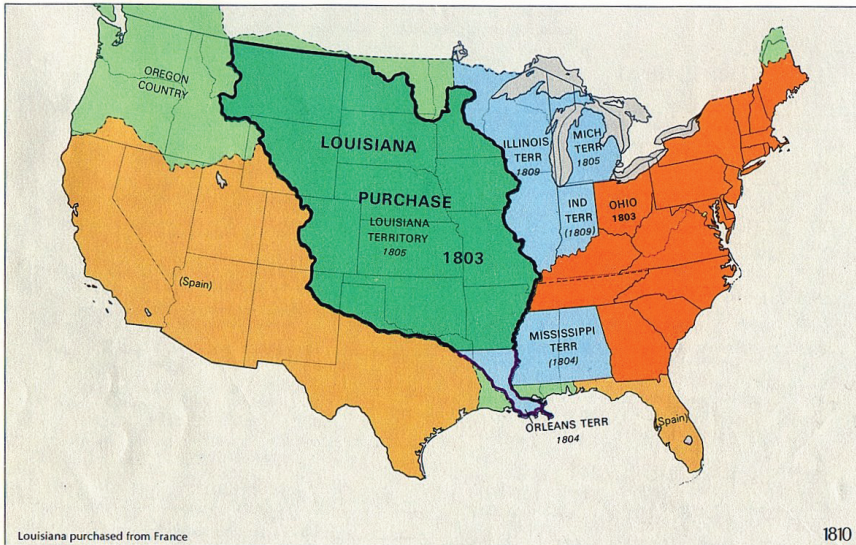


Louisiana Purchase

On April 30, 1803, the United States purchased from France the Louisiana Territory, more than 2 million sq km (800,000 sq mi) of land extending from the Mississippi River to the Rocky Mountains. The price was 60 million francs, or about \$15 million.



In 1803, France had fallen upon hardship. They had lost many soldiers to disease and battle and found themselves potentially facing war against Great Britain. Due to these challenges, France was in great need of money. In April, France offered to sell the Louisiana territories to the United States.

Present states that were included in the Louisiana Purchase were: Arkansas, Colorado, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Texas, and Wyoming.
