Making Predictions Task Cards

Suggested Activity

- Select four task cards of your choice. Make sure to choose *Before* task cards if you're starting a new book!
- ✓ On a separate sheet of paper, write 1–3 sentences in response to each task card. When possible, include text citations to support your predictions.

A **prediction**—based on an illustration or text clues—is a guess about what will happen next in the story. Active readers make predictions and support their predictions with evidence.
