The total price can be found by multiplying the number of items by the cost. Answer the questions below and show your work.

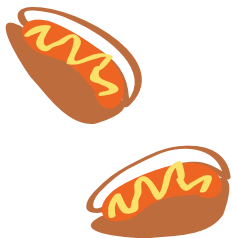

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3. A teacher bought 25 hotdogs for his students. Each one costs \$4. How much did the teacher pay?
