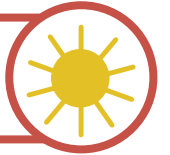




## More Comparative & Superlative Adjectives



A **comparative adjective** is used for comparing two people or things.

A **superlative adjective** is used for comparing three or more people or things.

ADJECTIVE	COMPARATIVE	SUPERLATIVE
big	bigger	biggest
