

Did You Know?

Mount Everest is the highest mountain in the world. It's 29,029 feet above sea level. That's almost five and a half miles! It is in Nepal, near the border of China.

Climbing to the top, or "summit," of Everest is extremely difficult and dangerous, and many people have died attempting it. Not only is the temperature extremely low, but the oxygen level at the summit is about one-third of the level of oxygen at sea level.
