Use the data found on the page "Mountains of the U.S." and answer the questions below.

- How many mountains located in Washington are on the chart?
- Subtract the lowest mountain from the highest mountain listed on the chart.

- Subtract the height of Huron Peak in Colorado from the height of Mt Augusta in Alaska.
- How many mountains located in California are on the chart?

- Add the second lowest mountain listed on the chart and the second highest mountain listed.
- Add the height of Mt. Yale in Colorado to the height of Mt. Whitney in California.

- Add together the height of the three mountains located in Washington.
- How many mountains on the chart are over 15,000 feet in height?

- Subtract the height of Liberty Cap in Washington from the height of White Mountain in California.
- Add the height of Castle Peak in Colorado to the height of Mt. Bear in Alaska.
