

Common or Proper?

A **common noun** names **any** person, place, or thing.

Examples: boy, state, month

A **proper noun** is the name of a **specific** person, place, or thing.

Proper nouns always begin with a capital letter.

Examples: Johnny, New York, February

Caroline lives in an apartment on Caton Avenue.

Jacob is taking a plane to California.

The zoo will be closed on Labor Day.

Nina's birthday is in March.

Uncle Ted lives by the lake in Wisconsin.

Did you see Winston at the party on Friday?

Quinn saw Venus through her telescope.

Ms. Brady bought us delicious pastries from the Sweet Spot.
