
## Number Card Games

Cut out the number cards on page 81. For more fun learning, you'll need to make a color copy of the number cards before cutting the cards apart.

Number Memory Match

Place each card face down on the table. Take turns lifting two cards, trying to find the pair. The player with the most pairs is the winner. **Note:** You'll need to make color copies of the number cards before cutting them apart.



Spread out the number cards face down on a table. Flip over a card and identify the number. Help your child collect that number of small objects from the playroom, kitchen, or family room—wherever you designate. For example, she might collect and count three spoons, five plastic cups, etc.

## Number Hide 'n Seek

Ask your child to search for the number cards you've hidden around the room or the house. As he finds each number card he must bring it to you and identify the number.

## Missing Number

Place the number cards face up in the correct sequence. Remove several number cards. Ask your child to identify the missing numbers.

## Number Fishing

Attach a paper clip to each number card. Make a fishing pole by attaching a string to a yardstick, ruler, or dowel rod. Tie a small magnet to the end of the string. Help your child fish for numbers. Your child must identify the number to keep the "fish." For more challenging play, your child must count aloud up to the number she has caught. Play together or with a friend. The player with the most "fish" at the end of the game wins.
