A plural noun shows that there is more than one person, place, thing, or idea.	
To form most plural nouns, follow these spelling rules:	
For most nouns , add -s .	one house → two houses
If the noun ends in -s, -ch, -sh, -ss, or -x, add -es.	one lunch → two lunches
If the noun ends in consonant-y , drop -y and add -ies .	one party → two parties
If the noun ends in vowel-y , add -s .	one day → two days
If the noun ends in -f or -fe and the / f / sound changes to / v / when plural, drop -f or -fe and add -ves .	one knife → two knives
If the noun ends in -f or -fe and the / f / sound does not change to / v / when plural, add -s .	one chef → two chefs
