Present perfect tense describes an action that happened at an indefinite time in the past or that began in the past and continues in the present. This tense is formed by using "has/have" with the past participle of the verb.

Example: I have walked to the grocery store many times.

Past perfect tense describes an action that took place in the past before another past action. This tense is formed by using "had" with the past participle of the verb. Example: By the time the rain started, I had walked 2 miles.

Future perfect tense describes an action that will occur in the future before some other action. This tense is formed by using "will have" with the past participle of the verb. Example: By the time the marathon is over, I will have run 26 miles.
