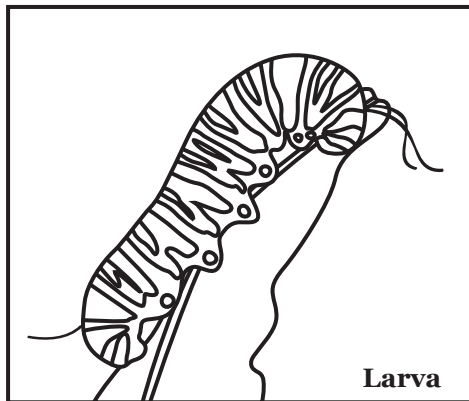


# The Monarch Butterfly



Larva

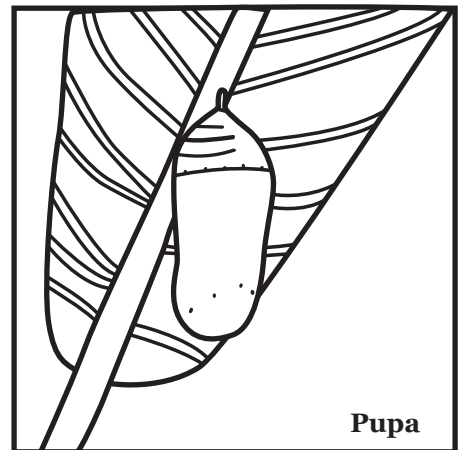
Color this placemat and learn some simple facts about the Monarch Butterfly.

★ A butterfly's life cycle has four parts:

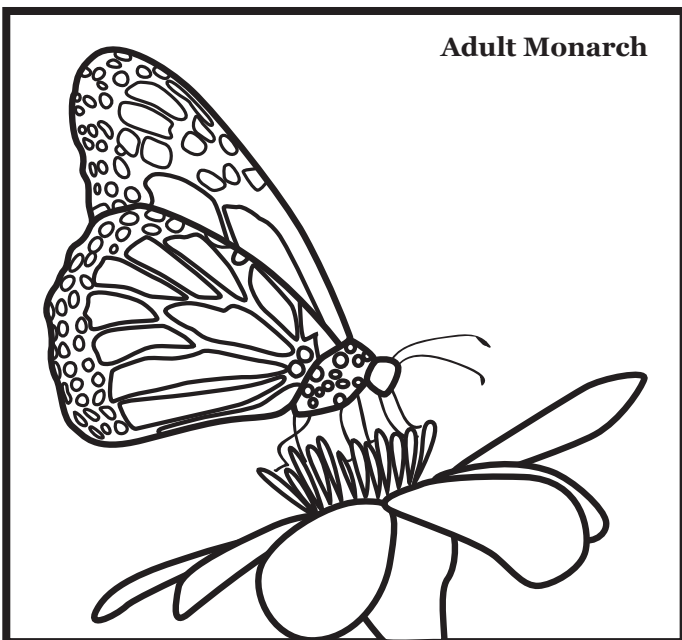
- Egg
- Larva (Caterpillar)
- Pupa (Chrysalis)
- Adult Butterfly

★ The Larva, or caterpillar, spend most of their time searching for food.

★ The monarch caterpillar has black, yellow and white stripes.

★ When the caterpillar is fully grown, they stop looking for food and look for a place to turn into a butterfly. To do this, they first transform into a pupa, or chrysalis.

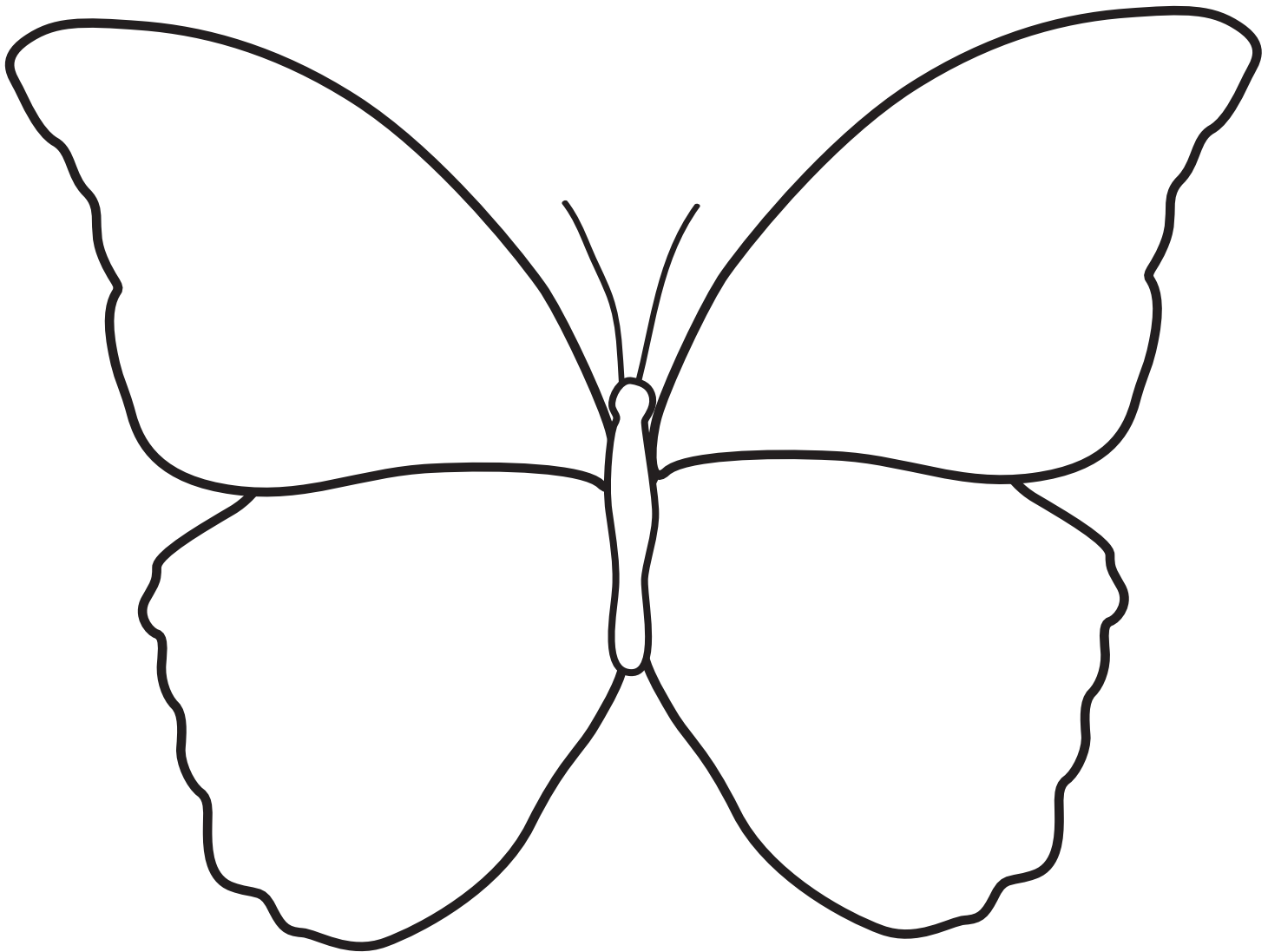
★ Many generations of monarchs migrate hundreds of miles each year. In North America, they range from Southern Canada to Northern South America.
