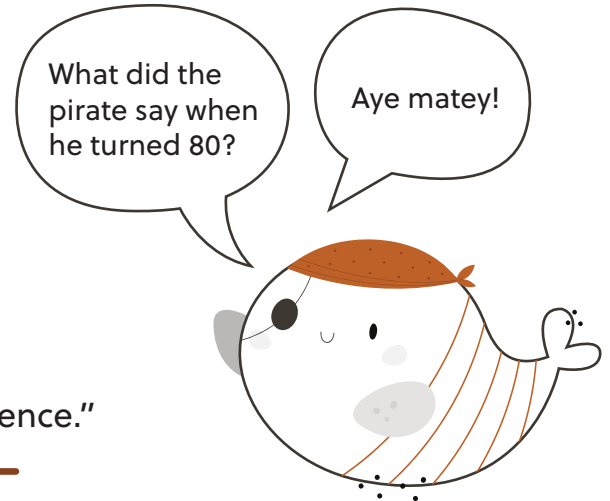


Play on Words

In this example, the author is using a play on words by swapping in the homophone "patients" for "patience."
