A **pronoun** is a word that replaces a noun or a noun phrase. They help our writing sound smooth and less repetitive. They also tell what point of view a story is written from.

First Person Point of View A character is telling the story. The character is in the story and is experiencing the action.		Third Person Point of View A narrator is telling the story. The narrator is <u>not</u> in the story, but is telling what is happening.
