

Puns with Homophones #2

A **pun** is a form of wordplay that uses multiple meanings of a word or phrase for a humorous effect. Some puns use homophones to give a statement double meaning.

Remember, **homophones** are words that sound the same but have different meanings and different spellings, like 'there' and 'their'.
