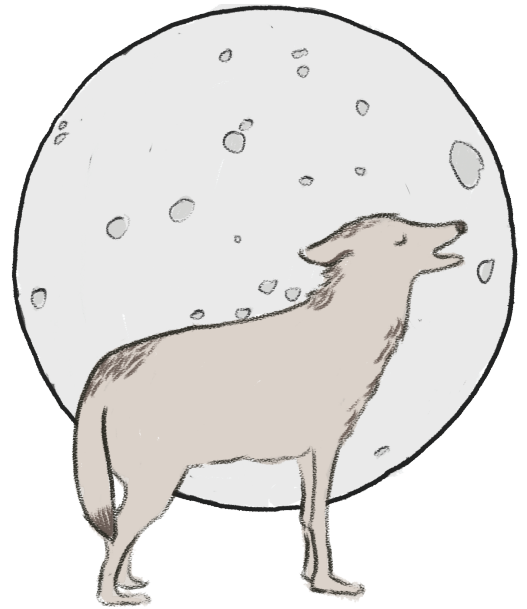


# Put it into Plural Form

A **plural noun** is more than one person, place, thing, or idea. Follow these rules when changing nouns from singular to plural form:



Nouns ending in:	Make plural by:
ch, sh, ss, x, zz	add -es
a consonant and y	drop the y, add -ies
f or fe	drop the f, add -ves
