


Ancient Egyptian Life Great Queens - Nefertiti






Queen Nefertiti


Nefertiti, sometimes called Great Royal Wife, lived around the mid 1300s BC. She was the wife of Pharaoh Akhenaten, and is believed to later on taken on the role of co-consort to him. The Pharaoh and his queen became worshipers of of Aten, the sun disc, changing the known religion of worshiping many gods to worshiping one god only. She became famous after a stunning bust of her was found by archaeologists.



Up until then most ancient Egypian art had not shown accuracy in human facial features. Her bust is accredited to the pharaoh's sculptor at the time, Thutmose. She is also believed by some to be King Tutankhamun's aunt.
