As the clock struck twelve he heard 162 a rustling noise in the air, and a bird came flying that was of pure gold; and 179 as it was snapping at one of the apples with its beak, the gardener's son 194 jumped up and shot an arrow at it. But the arrow did the bird no harm; only it 212 dropped a golden feather from its tail, and then flew away. The golden 225 feather was brought to the king in the morning, and all the council was called 240 together. Everyone agreed that it was worth more than all the wealth of the 254 kingdom: but the king said, "One feather is of no use to me, I must have the 271 whole bird." 273
