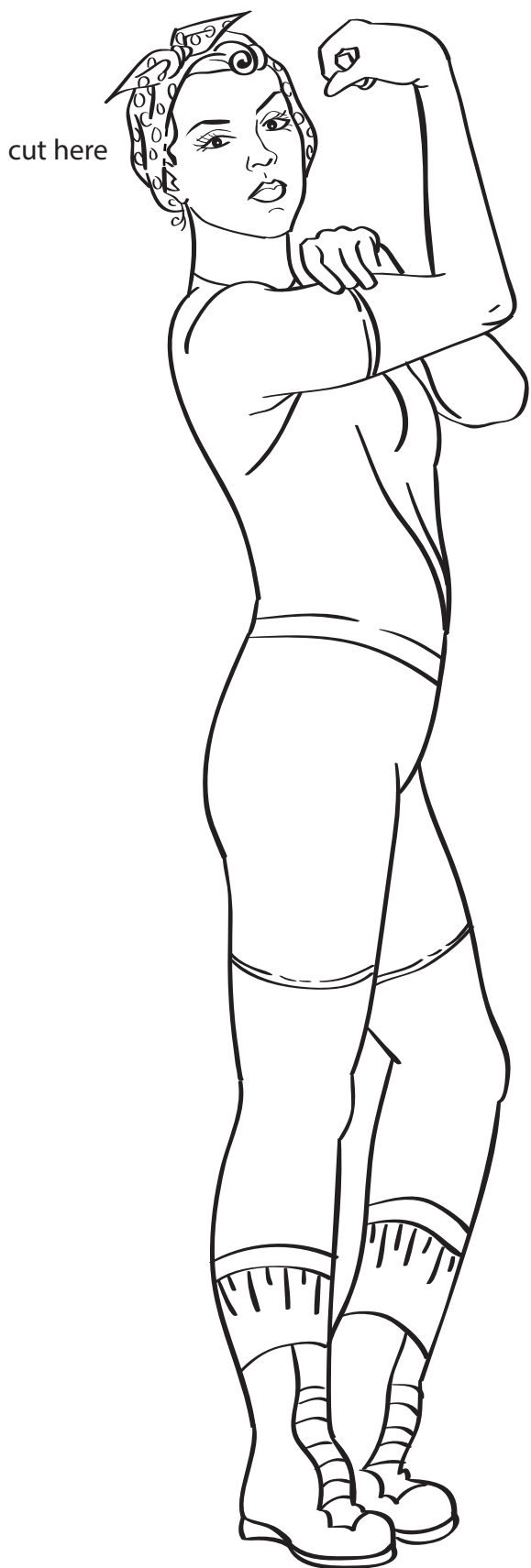


WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH: Paper Dolls
