

DIAGRAMMING SENTENCES

Articles

An article clarifies a noun. In sentence diagrams, an article is placed on a slanted line below the noun it clarifies.

Example: The bird sings.

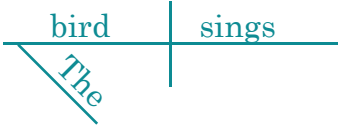


Diagram the following simple sentences, using only the subject, predicate and article.

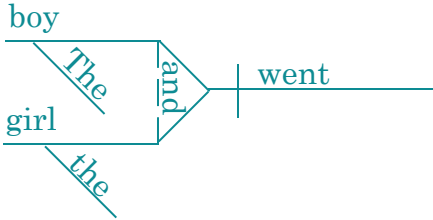
An umbrella protects me.
