

# SENTENCE MIX-UP GAME

declarative, interrogative, exclamatory, and imperative

**PLAYERS:** 3-4

**MATERIALS:**

Dry erase board, eraser, and marker for each player, plus one extra board

One die

Chart (below)

Scoreboard

**INSTRUCTIONS:**

1. Review the four kinds of sentences, their punctuation and the example sentences provided.
2. Ensure that each player has a dry erase board, eraser, and a marker.
3. Player one rolls the die.
4. Everyone creates a sentence of that type. This will be the start of a story.
5. When everyone is done, each person shares their sentence.
6. The group votes on their favorite sentence to start the story. The person with the most votes gets one point, then writes their sentence on page 2 of this worksheet.
7. Set that sentence aside so everyone can see it.
8. Player two starts back at step three. Each time, the player creates a sentence that continues the story from the previous sentence, still displayed.
9. Continue until the story comes to an end, or the group can decide on the number of rounds.
10. Share your story with the class.

FOUR KINDS OF SENTENCES			
DECLARATIVE	Statement	.	I sat on the egg.
INTERROGATIVE	Question	?	Who sat on the egg?
EXCLAMATORY	Exclamation	!	He smashed my egg!
IMPERATIVE	Command	.	Don't sit on the egg.
