## SIMPLE VERB TENSE

A <u>verb</u> is an action word. It tells you what a noun does.



Tense	Summary	Rules	Examples
past	shows an action that already happened	Regular past- tense verbs end in <b>-ed</b> .	<ul> <li>Amara walked to the park yesterday.</li> <li>Nate shared his snack with me.</li> <li>Susie danced to the fun music.</li> </ul>
present	shows an action that is happening now	Regular present- tense verbs have no ending, or they end in -s or -es.	<ul> <li>We kick the ball back and forth.</li> <li>Caleb jumps in the puddles.</li> <li>The dog catches a ball in the air.</li> </ul>
future	shows an action that is going to happen	Future- tense verbs use the word " <b>will</b> " before the verb.	<ul> <li>Liam will go to the library tomorrow.</li> <li>Mrs. Tripp will read a book to the class.</li> <li>Aria will visit her grandma tomorrow.</li> </ul>
