

# SIMPLE VERB TENSE

A **verb** is an action word.  
It tells you what a noun does.



Tense	Summary	Rules	Examples
<b>past</b>	shows an action that already happened	Regular past-tense verbs end in <b>-ed</b> .	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Amara <b>walked</b> to the park yesterday.</li><li>● Nate <b>shared</b> his snack with me.</li><li>● Susie <b>danced</b> to the fun music.</li></ul>
<b>present</b>	shows an action that is happening now	Regular present-tense verbs have no ending, or they end in <b>-s</b> or <b>-es</b> .	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● We <b>kick</b> the ball back and forth.</li><li>● Caleb <b>jumps</b> in the puddles.</li><li>● The dog <b>catches</b> a ball in the air.</li></ul>
<b>future</b>	shows an action that is going to happen	Future-tense verbs use the word <b>“will”</b> before the verb.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Liam <b>will go</b> to the library tomorrow.</li><li>● Mrs. Tripp <b>will read</b> a book to the class.</li><li>● Aria <b>will visit</b> her grandma tomorrow.</li></ul>
