

Passover



Passover is one of the most important holidays in the Jewish tradition. Originally an ancient harvest festival, it now celebrates the Israelites' escape from slavery in Egypt around 1225 B.C.E. The holiday begins with a ritual meal called a Seder. The Haggadah, the text that guides the Seder, tells the Biblical tale of the ten plagues visited upon Egypt to convince the Pharaoh to free the slaves. According to the tale, the Pharaoh finally released the slaves, but changed his mind and began to pursue them. They fled toward the Red Sea, carrying their bread with them. The bread did not have time to rise, and baked into flat cakes in the desert sun. This part of the story is the reason matzah, the traditional flat bread, is a central part of the Seder.
