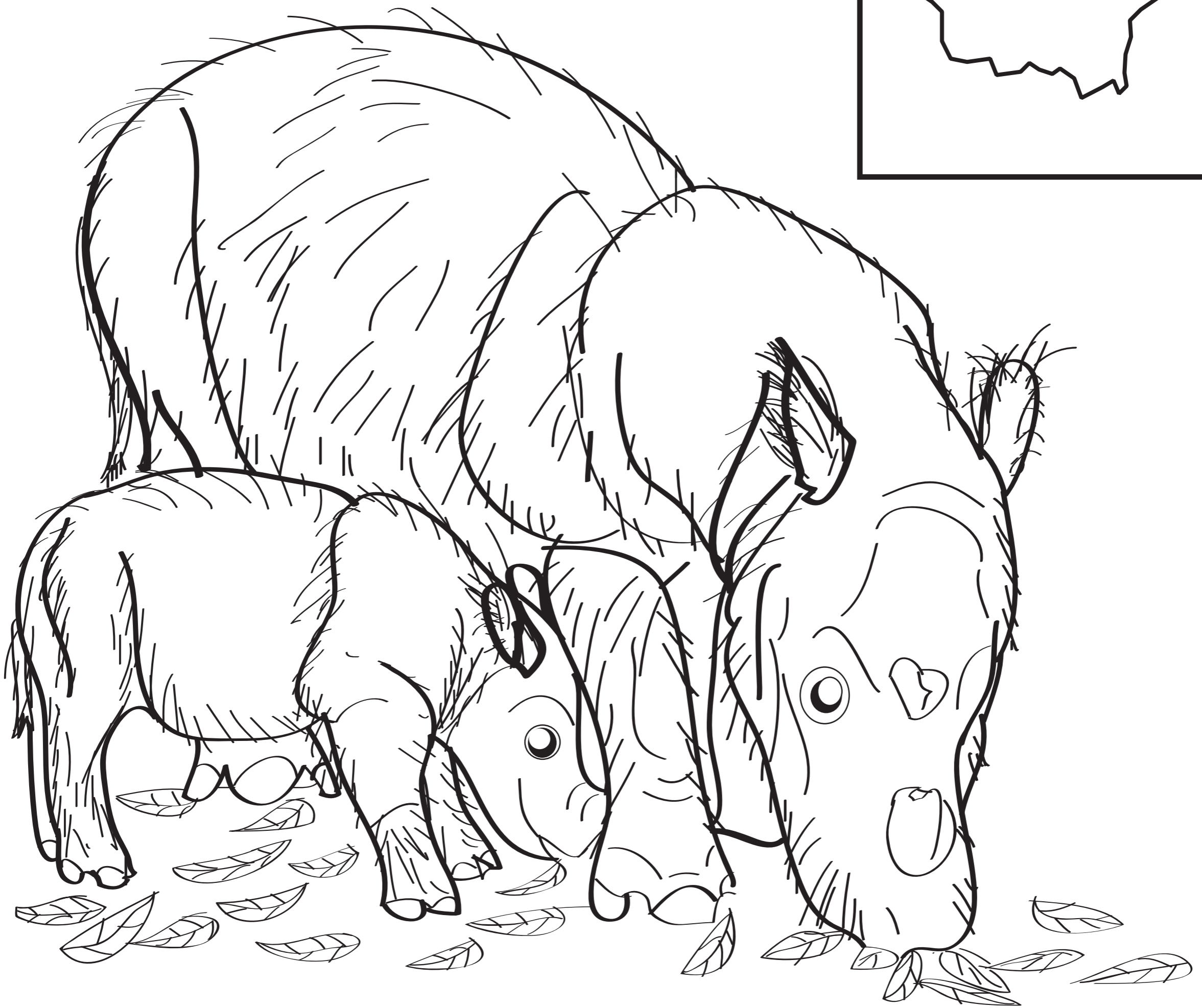


Endangered Species

Sumatran Rhinoceros

The Sumatran Rhinoceros has only six populations, distributed throughout three islands near Indonesia, including Borneo, Sumatra and the Maylay Peninsula. They have long, shaggy hair that is reddish-brown. There are only an estimated 275 animals left in the wild. They are threatened mainly by deforestation, and by poachers, who can sell the horns for high prices.
