

# SUMMER ANALOGIES

**Analogies** show relationships between two pairs of words.

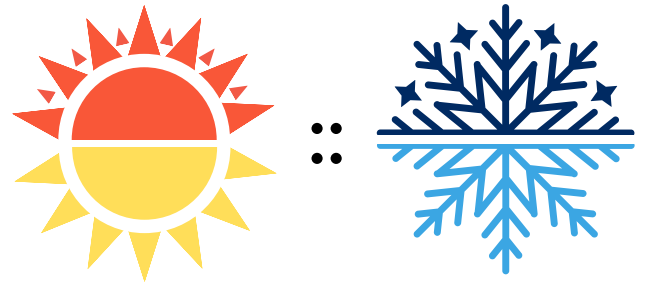
**EXAMPLE:** scorching : hot :: frigid : cold

You can read the analogy like this:

**scorching** is to **hot** as **frigid** is to **cold**

Scorching is intensely hot, and frigid is intensely cold.

These are both pairs of degree or intensity.



Some common analogy relationships include synonyms, antonyms, characteristics, degree, cause/effect, item/category, item/purpose, and part/whole.
