

# WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH: Paper Dolls

## Susan B. Anthony

Until 1920, women were not allowed to vote at all. Together with her friend Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Susan B. Anthony and hundreds of suffragettes fought for women's rights, including the right to vote. The 19th Amendment, allowing women the vote, was passed in 1920.

**DID YOU KNOW?** In 1872, Susan was arrested for placing her vote in the U.S. presidential election. She went to trial, where she was not allowed to defend herself, and was fined \$100 (nearly \$1900 in today's money!). She never paid it.
