# Taking Notes With Informational Texts: Central Idea and Key Details



The **central idea** (sometimes called the main idea) of an informational text is what the text is all about. We state the central idea in a broad, one-sentence statement.

You can use clues like text features, text structure, and thesis statements to determine the central idea of a text. The key details in a passage will directly support the central idea.
