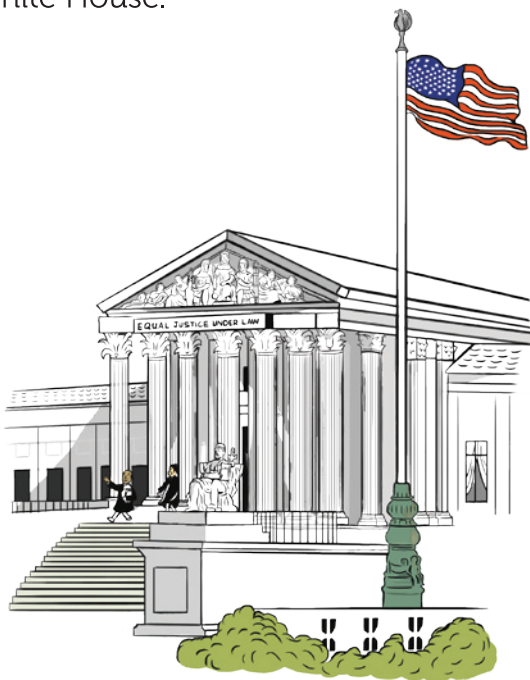
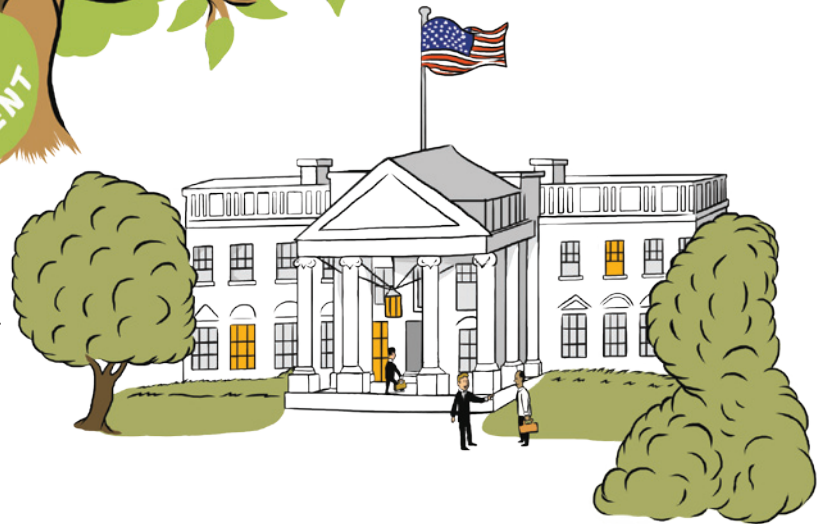




## Executive Branch:

The president leads the executive branch, carrying out laws, vetoing laws, directing national defense, and directing government. This branch works in the White House.



## Judicial Branch:

The Supreme Court, made of nine judges, leads the Judicial Branch. This branch reviews laws and decides cases that involve states' rights. This branch works in the Supreme Court Building.

## Legislative Branch:

The House of Representatives includes 435 voting members, and the Senate includes 100 people. These people make up Congress, and they lead the legislative branch. They make laws, then send them to the president for approval. This branch works in the United States Capitol.
