Part of Intro Paragraph	Description	Write Yours Here
Hook	The HOOK is usually first 1-3 sentences of the introductory paragraph. It grabs the reader's attention and entices them to read on.	
Reason #1	This is the first REASON that you will use to support your claim during the essay.	
Reason #2	This is the second REASON that you will use to support your claim during the essay.	
Reason #3	This is the third REASON that you will use to support your claim during the essay.	
Claim	This is the statement or CLAIM that you are making in your essay. All of your reasons support this claim. This will be the last sentence in your introductory paragraph.
