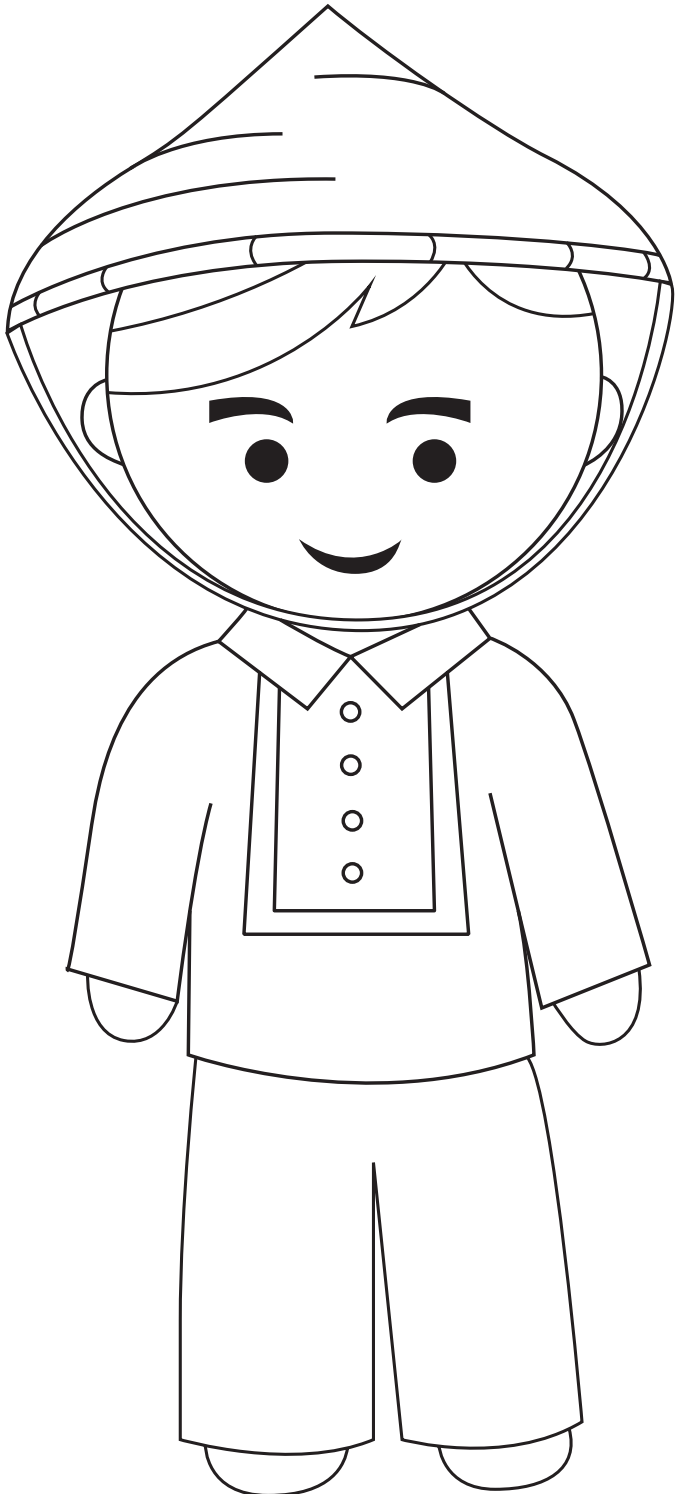

Barong

is the official national costume of Filipino men made from pineapple fibers. The upper garment is called a barong and is usually worn over a Chinese collarless shirt called “camisa de Chino.”

A traditional wide-brimmed hat known as “salakot”, can also be paired with a barong, which is usually made of rattan or reeds.

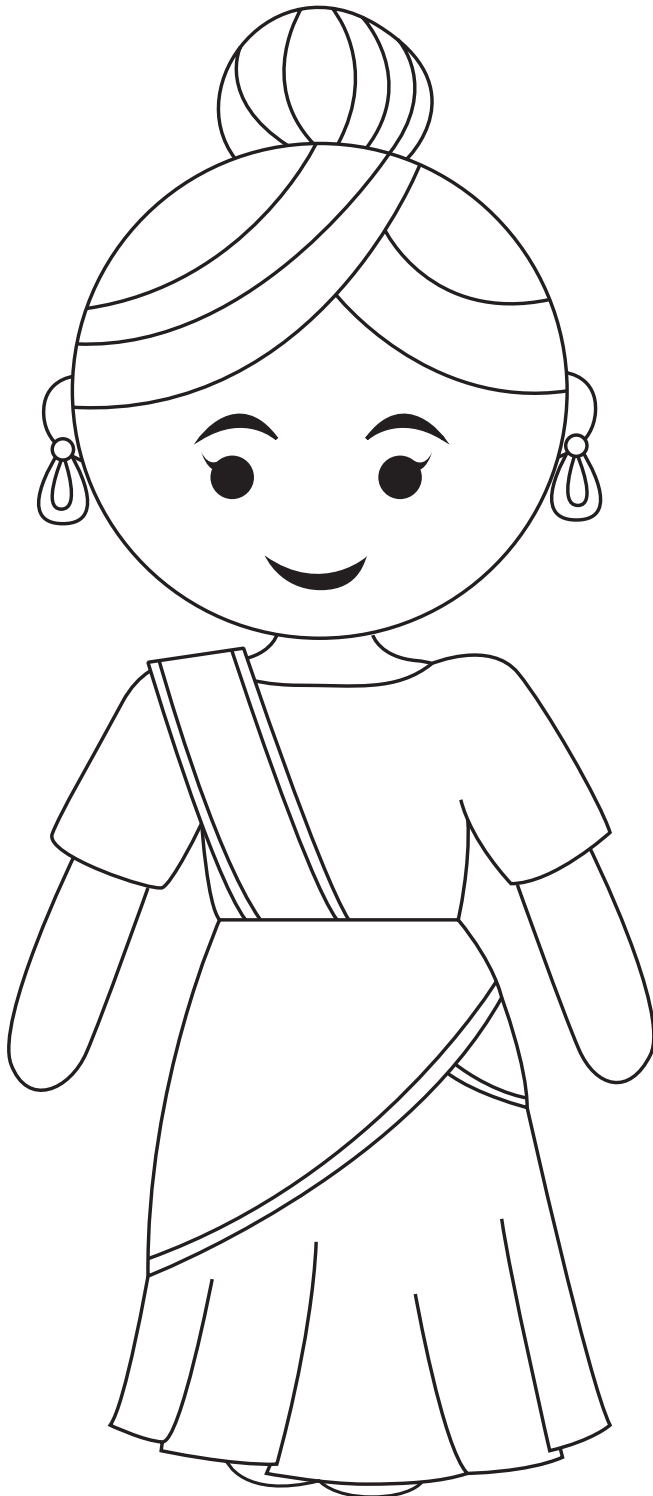
Question:

Baro at Saya

is also often referred to as “Baro’t Saya” which is a traditional Filipino blouse and skirt ensemble.

It originated in Spanish times and it consists of the “saya,” a long wrap-around, or a “tapis,” a knee-length wrap-around, paired with the “baro,” which is a short-sleeved blouse with no collar.
