Fustanella

also known as “tsolias” is a Greek national costume for men and is often worn by diplomats and warriors.

It is composed of a white pleated skirt called the “fustanella,” a white shirt with wide, flowing sleeves, a woolen vest, a sash that is worn around the waist, and pointed shoes with large pompons.

This clothing is worn mainly in the central and southern parts of Greece and the nearby Balkan regions.

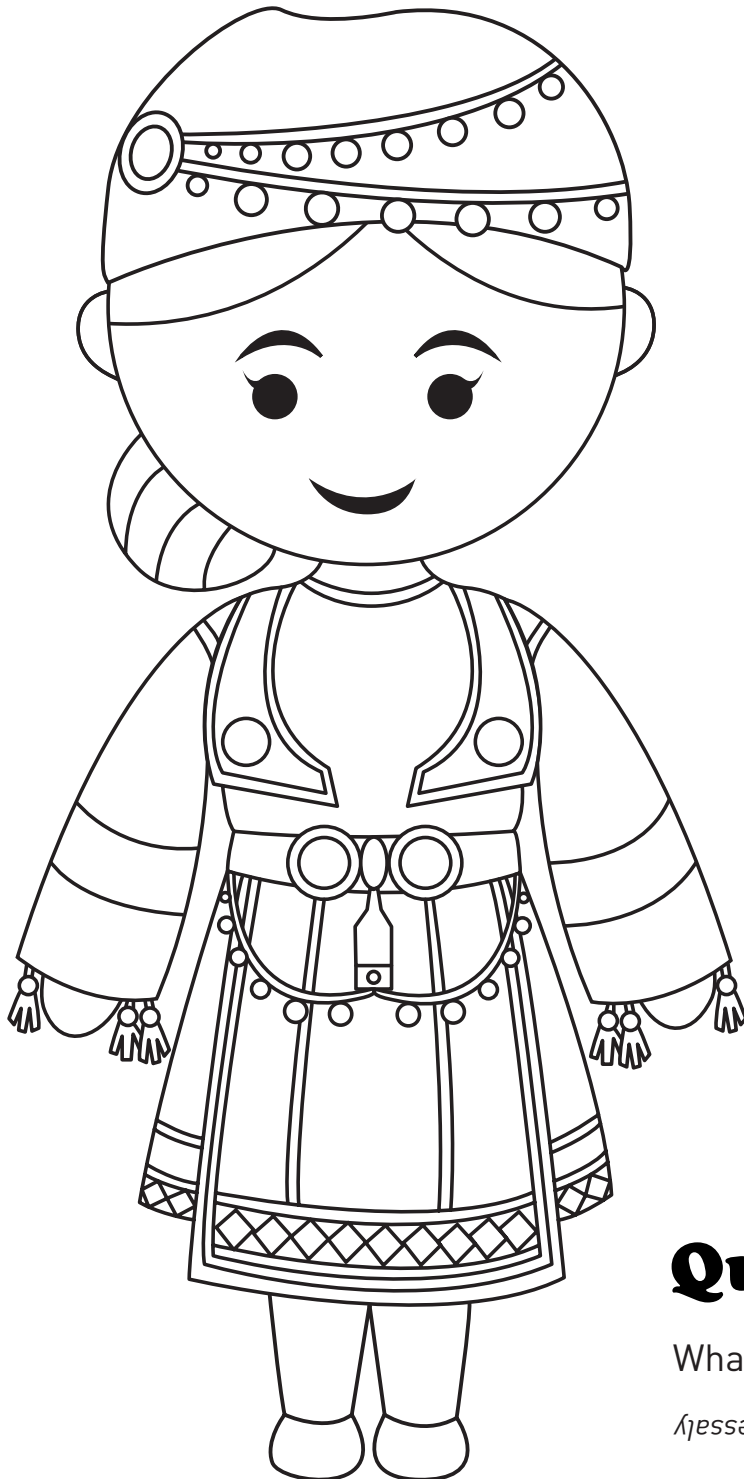

Karagouna

is the famous female costume from Thessaly in Central Greece. It is an ornate wedding dress with bright colors symbolizing the wealth of the valley of Thessaly.
